

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# I. A Brief History of Methodism in Arizona and Southern Nevada

## The First Missionaries

The first missionaries to Arizona, or what was then part of the New Mexico Territory, arrived in February 1859. The Reverends Horace Bishop and David Tuthill were transferred to the California Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church with the intent to serve as missionaries. They arrived in southeastern Arizona, with Rev. Bishop going to Tucson and Rev. Tuthill at Tubac. Both ministers traveled a 150-mile radius of those communities and found it necessary to preach at six different places. They gave up their circuits by September 1859, stating language problems, the scattered population, and the Catholic faith as reasons.

The next mention of work in the Arizona Territory occurred in March 1868, when Rev. John L. Dyer, Presiding Elder of the Santa Fe District of the Colorado Conference, Methodist Episcopal Church preached at Ft. Defiance. Rev. Dyer was a wandering circuit rider, and he would often go “from some point on his district and travel in a given direction until he came to a settlement, and there he would hold a meeting or series of meetings, and then he would proceed” on. The spirit only guided him once to Arizona.

## Work Begins: Three Ministers, Three Callings

It was in 1870 that three Methodist ministers arrived in Arizona Territory about the same time, with each following a different calling. The first to arrive was Rev. Charles H. Cook of the Rock River Conference, Methodist Episcopal Church. He was serving as a missionary in Chicago when he read an article in a New York magazine about the Native Americans in Arizona and appealing for missionaries. Rev. Cook applied for funds from the Methodist Episcopal Church to start a mission. Even though he was told that no funds were available, Rev. Cook felt the call so strongly that he sold his possessions to fund his travel and set out for the territory. Rev. Cook arrived at Ft. Bowie on Sunday, December 4, 1870. Here he stayed for a time, ministering to the soldiers. Rev. Cook again applied for funds to establish a mission and again he was denied. Persevering, he set out, locating a Pima village (the Akimel O’odham people) along the banks of the Gila River. He was appointed as a government teacher on the Reservation there, and at Sacaton he set up a school and mission. After once again being denied funding by the Methodist Episcopal Church for his mission, Rev. Cook united with the Presbyterian Church, which adopted his mission. Rev. Cook would later establish the Cook Bible School in Tempe, which continues in spirit today as Cook Native American Ministries.

Rev. Alexander Gilmore was a member of the New Jersey Conference, Methodist Episcopal Church and was serving as a Chaplain in the U.S. Army. The Company he was attached to was sent west to Ft. Whipple, arriving after a long march on Wednesday, December 7, 1870. The following Sunday, Rev. Gilmore preached at the fort and then travelled to nearby Prescott for services at the territorial capitol. In February 1871 a Sunday School was organized in Prescott, with Rev. Gilmore as the superintendent.

The third minister belonged to the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. Rev. Alexander Groves was sent as a missionary by his Conference. The Los Angeles Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South held its first meeting in October 1870. The Conference voted to send a missionary to Arizona Territory and Rev. Groves was selected. He set out for the territory soon after the meeting, arriving first in Phoenix. There he spent about a week before travelling north to the territorial capitol. When Rev. Groves arrived in Prescott on December 13th, he found that Rev. Gilmore had already been there for almost week. The following weekend, December 17-18, Rev. Grove and Rev. Gilmore held services together at the courthouse. Over the next 70 years until unification, the two Methodist churches would work together in Arizona.

## The Arizona Mission

In 1860 the work in Arizona Territory was transferred from the California Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church and put under the Missionary Society. At that time, domestic missions were treated the same as foreign missions. A Superintendent overseeing the work and ministers would serve appointments for various lengths but retained conference membership in their home Conference. The first Superintendent of the Arizona Mission was not appointed until 1872. Rev. Glezen A. Reeder of the North Ohio Conference was approached by Bishop

Matthew Simpson at his Annual Conference in September 1872. Mrs. Reeder was not available for consultation, having not attended Conference and beyond the reach of the telegraph. Rev. Reeder later wrote, that "Neither tongue nor pen can ever tell the struggle of my heart during these six brief hours in which I had to decide the questions." After much thought and prayer, he accepted the appointment.

Rev. Reeder travelled to Arizona alone, leaving his family in Ohio. There, Mrs. Reeder was instrumental in raising funds to purchase many of the items needed for the establishment and running of a new mission and churches. In early spring 1873, Rev. Reeder arrived at Prescott, where the Arizona Mission would be administered from. He found two churches: a Methodist Episcopal church led by Rev. Alexander Gilmore and a Methodist Episcopal, South church ministered to by Rev. Alexander Groves. Rev. Reeder's detailed and colorful reports to the Missionary Society described Arizona and its inhabitants. The Superintendent described his first tour around the new mission, covering a 1,100 mile circuit: Starting in Prescott and travelling to Wickenburg, then on to Ehrenburg, down the Colorado River to Yuma. The circuit continued on to Tucson, then turned north through Florence to Phoenix, before finishing back in Prescott. There is even a bit of tongue-in-cheek about a travelling party made up of a Methodist missionary, Jewish trader, and Catholic mail rider. At several of the places along his circuit, Rev. Reeder was able to secure town lots that would one day host a church. The field was difficult, in reports he described the "unfriendly climate and hostile Indians," the cost of everything "stands at a fabulous [expensive] price," and "traveling through this mission is... very fatiguing." In addition, the most populous enterprise was the saloon, Catholicism had a strong hold on the southern portion of the territory, and most of the population was single men who had no interest in being guided morally. Rev. Reeder was simply worn-out after three years in Arizona, after "having held five protracted meetings and one camp-meeting; having preached four hundred and twenty-two sermons and traveled fourteen thousand miles, and spent the nights of two years traveling, or laying in my blankets, on boards, or the bosom of the earth." He departed for his family in 1875, leaving behind one established church at Prescott with a membership of forty-six souls and two ministers at work in the Mission.

Rev. Derrick B. Wright of the Troy Conference (New York) arrived in Prescott on July 23, 1874 with his "heroic wife" and two young daughters. Their travel to Arizona Territory took two and a half months and crossed more than 8,000 miles. He took over the pastorate of Prescott, becoming its first full-time minister. After the departure of Rev. Reeder, Rev. Wright served as the de facto superintendent of the Mission, able to do little "but to hold the ground." Rev. Gilmore continued to assist at Prescott and the surrounding areas from his post at Ft. Whipple. They were joined by Rev. J. M. Winnega, who arrived in 1877, and started a new work in the Florence and Picket Post area. He stayed for less than a year, being replaced by Rev. John J. Wingar who arrived with his family about February 1878.

The next Superintendent of the Arizona Mission was Rev. George Adams of the Colorado Conference. In 1875 he was serving as financial agent of Central City, Colorado when approached by Bishop Matthew Simpson about the Arizona Mission. Rev. Adams refused the position as Superintendent temporarily, until the financial situation with Central City was resolved. In early summer 1879, Rev. Adams successfully paid off the church's debt and accepted the appointment as Superintendent in Arizona. He and his wife arrived at Prescott on September 5, 1879 and immediately went to work. He set out on "my first trip of exploration through the territory, traveling in about four weeks nearly 1,000 miles, all but 50 miles by stage, including 36 miles over the Pinal range of mountains on the back of a mule and on a narrow mountain trail."

Changes in appointments occurred in September 1879, with Rev. Wright moving from Prescott to Florence and continuing Rev. Wingar's work there, while the latter went to Globe and organized a new church. About the same time, "Mr. [William G.] Mills, a local preacher, appointed to Tucson, has entered upon his work with much promise" and would organize a church there, which would two years later host the first Annual Meeting of the Mission. By 1880, after ten years of work in Arizona, there were four churches organized, with three ministers, a local pastor, and several military chaplains in the field. As Rev. Adams pointed out in a report, "The Arizona Mission can hardly be called an organization as yet."

The next decade would see rapid expansion of the Mission. The population was growing with more families, the railroad arrived across the southern portion of the territory in 1877, and the Apache Wars were ending. The first Annual Meeting of the Arizona Mission was called to order on the morning of July 7, 1881 by Bishop Thomas Bowman. They met at the Presbyterian Church in Tucson, as the Methodist Episcopal church was still under construction. Six ministers, one local pastor, and one lay person attended with ten charge points named:

There would be no Annual Meeting in 1882 as not a single Bishop was able to make the journey to Arizona. Rev. Adams admitted in his October 1882 report, “I have been greatly embarrassed in my work on account of the frequent change in our ministerial working force...Every man who was appointed to the mission by Bishop Bowman during his visit last year [1881] is gone, and every charge has been supplied by a new minister.” While not entirely true as Rev. Daniel W. Calfee would continue to serve in the Mission for several more years, it does show a major hurdle in the work. Keeping ministers in Arizona for more than a year would be an issue that would plague the Mission for the next few decades. The work was hard, lonely, and remote. “Nearly all the charges are remote from each other, and long stage-rides are necessary to reach them. The preachers rarely see the face of a[nother] minister from one year’s end to another” wrote Rev. Adams. Over the 50-year history of the Mission, most ministers would only serve for a short time in Arizona.

The 1880s were a time of slow growth for the Mission, with seven charges and ministers in 1880 to thirteen charges filled by eight ministers in 1890. New churches were built at Globe, Tombstone, Phoenix, Pinal and Tucson and new congregations organized at Benson, Flagstaff, Gila River, Kingman, Tempe and Willcox, Bisbee, and Yuma. Church membership increased from 57 in 1880 to 348 in 1890. Rev. Adams explained the sluggish advancement on the “constant change in *personnel* of the mission, thus crippling and retarding the work,” usually caused by the long, hard travel for those riding the circuits. From 1879-1890 about thirty different missionaries served in Arizona, with the majority staying one year or less. The expansion of the population, more towns, better roads, and an increasing number of railroads would make the work a bit easier in later decades.

One of Rev. Adam’s goals was to have a Methodist school in Arizona. 10 acres of land was acquired just beyond the original Phoenix townsite. Rev. Oliver S. Frambes was invited to Arizona due to his success with the Los Angeles Academy, which served as the foundation for the University of Southern California. Rev. and Mrs. Frambes opened the Phoenix High School about January 1887. The school operated for only one year before the Frambes went to Tempe and organizing a church there. “But on account of the impossibility of securing a suitable building it was thought best to discontinue the school until a suitable place could be obtained.” Fund raising to build was almost complete by 1890, though the ill health of the Mission Superintendent effected the effort. This did not dash the hopes of a school in Arizona. The Arizona Wesleyan University was incorporated, in name only, with Rev. George Adams as President. In the end, the school never came to be for many reasons. The land obtained for the school would later be traded to the Methodist Episcopal Church, South.

Increasing blindness caused Rev. Adams to retire in 1890. He and his wife stayed at their home in Phoenix until their passing, continuing to “parent” the Mission and its ministers as they were able. The third Superintendent of the Arizona Mission was Rev. George F. Bovard of the Southern California Conference. He had previously served in the Mission on the Camp Verde circuit for a few months and for a year at Phoenix in 1880-1882. In his first report in 1891, Rev. Bovard wrote that he was pleased with the “wisdom and tact” that “our churches are planted in the most important towns in the Territory, and in the most desirable locations of said towns.” At Prescott on August 2, 1891, during the evening service, a lamp was overturned and the church burned down. The loss of the first church dealt a blow to the Mission, but within weeks a new church was under construction. By 1894, Rev. Bovard claimed that “We are nearly as strong as all other Protestant churches [in Arizona] combined” but there was still much work to be done, as Arizona continued to be a “hotbed of infidelity, skepticism and free thoughtism” and that the “mining camps, railroad towns, lumber regions, and grazing lands do not give permanence, which is essential to real advancement in Christian work.” The fortunes of many towns were tied to the mines, and the church was tied to the town. When the mines boomed, the towns boomed; but when the mines closed, the area would become a ghost town almost overnight. Tombstone was one such church. In 1884 it had the third largest membership in the Mission, but the church was closed in 1898 after Tombstone became a ghost town.

In 1897 Rev. Bovard was recalled to the Southern California Conference to serve as the Presiding Elder of the Los Angeles District. After seven years leading the Arizona Mission, he had grown it to a membership of 707 souls with 26 charge points across 13 circuits. New churches had been organized at Williams, Winslow, Mesa, Glendale, and at Needles, California.

The fourth Superintendent of the Arizona Mission was Rev. Samuel A. Thomson. He arrived in 1897 from the Southern California Conference. 1898 was the first year all charges had ministers appointed to them and 1900 saw the membership reach 1,002. Congregations were added at Jerome (1900) and Douglas (1903). In February 1904, Rev. Thomson was reappointed to be the Pasadena District Presiding Elder, leaving the Arizona Mission without its a Superintendent.

Rev. Samuel J. Rogers of the Colorado Conference was found to serve as the next Superintendent. He came to Arizona from the Wyoming Mission, where he was serving as that mission's Superintendent. In 1904 the General Conference added Sonora, Mexico to the Arizona Mission's territory, serving the English-speaking population in that state. Rev. Rogers saw new churches organized at Bowie, Blythe (California), Chandler, and Holbrook. The presiding Bishop at the 1905 Annual Meeting was Bishop Joseph Berry, who had served in the Mission at Tucson in 1881-1882 before he was elected to the Episcopacy in 1904. The 1906 report from Rev. Rogers noted that "Methodism is keeping pace with the growth of this land of great possibilities" and that all communities of any size have "a church and a minister." In 1912, when Arizona became a state, the membership of the Mission stood at 1,993 across 28 charges.

In 1906, a Women's Home Missionary Society was organized. They took over Rev. James Crouch's work on the Ft. Yuma Indian Reservation. By 1910 money had been raised to build a chapel on the Reservation. The Ft. Yuma Indian Mission was the only work among Native Americans in the Arizona Mission – and for all of Methodism within Arizona and southern Nevada for nearly a century.

A remarkable woman arrived in Arizona in 1906 when Deaconess Lulu Clifton retired to the Territory due to tuberculosis. As Clifton recovered, she saw the need for a hospital to serve those flocking to the desert for similar reasons as herself. With help from the M.E. Church, in 1911 she rented an apartment building in Phoenix, and opened one of the city's first hospitals. The Arizona Deaconess Hospital operated at capacity from the start. A nurse training program was soon added, teaching both laity and deaconesses. The M.E. Church and Arizona Mission led funding drives to secure a larger, permanent home for the hospital. In 1917, land was traded between the two Methodist denominations in Arizona, with the unused site for a school going to the M.E. Church, South, and their revival grounds going to the M.E. Church. Construction on the new hospital at 10th Street and McDowell Road was halted soon after it started because of World War I. The new Arizona Deaconess Hospital finally opened in 1923 with 105 beds. The name was changed in 1928 to Good Samaritan Hospital as a donor request. In the 1968 after changes to federal laws concerning government funding and ecclesiastical institutions, the hard decision was made remove the Methodist Church's oversite from the hospital and disaffiliate with the denomination.

The last Superintendent of the Arizona Mission was Rev. Alvah W. Adkinson from the Southern California Conference, arriving in 1912. Rev. Adkinson administered the Mission from his home and office in Los Angeles, California. In 1915, the church at Flagstaff voted to federate with the Presbyterian Church, becoming Flagstaff Federated Church on January 1, 1916. The Presbyterian church building was sold to the Flagstaff Mexican M.E. Church, later known as El Divino Redentor Iglesia Methodista. The Spanish Flu pandemic in 1917-1919 greatly affected the work of the Mission. "On account of the influenza the new year opened under a gloom that we could not penetrate. No services could be held... Our pastors were helpless. The authorities would not allow them to call on the sick. The well were afraid to have them call lest they should bring the sickness. Only at funerals were they in demand, and these had to be semi-private, and the utmost precaution taken to avoid the spread of the disease... The quarantine against the influenza made it impossible to assemble the Mission for its Annual Session last year..." Instead, for 1918 Superintendent Adkinson and Bishop Wilbur P. Thirkield met and worked out the appointments and other business. During Rev. Adkinson' 8-year tenure, churches were added at Ajo, Oatman and McNeal.

At the request of the Arizona Mission, "An enabling act was passed at the [1920] General Conference, authorizing the union of the Arizona mission and the Southern California Conference." The union was declared effective at the 1920 meeting of the Southern California Conference on September 29, 1920. Rev. Adkinson gave his report at the meeting: "After thirty-eight years of organized life the Arizona Mission ceases to exist as a separate body and becomes part of the Southern California Conference... We come to you today with 28 charges, with 23

effective ministers... [and] membership about 4,100." The Arizona Mission had existed for 50 years and succeeded in its mission of bringing the word of God to the people of Arizona.

### **Arizona as a District of the Southern California Conference**

During the latter years of the Arizona Mission, most of the personnel was supplied by the Southern California Conference, including the mission's Superintendents. For many years the mission was treated as a training ground for new pastors. This continued after the merger of the two bodies. In 1925, Arizona District Superintendent Rev. Abraham L. Baker noted in his report, "Arizona will always be a feeder for California... we must... bring in the best from our schools who, after a few years in Arizona, may easily be placed in California." By 1932, the District Superintendent of Arizona, Rev. Will A. Betts, reported that Arizona was no longer "an appendix to the royalty of California." However, Arizona would continue to feel remote. The great distances, with travel by rail or car, meant that Arizona continued to feel disconnected from the Conference.

The Great Depression, begun in 1929, caused the Southern California Conference to reevaluate its structure. In 1933 the Arizona District was dissolved, with the churches split between the Pasadena District (renamed Pasadena-Arizona) and the San Diego District (renamed San Diego-Phoenix). The district offices were located in California, meaning less frequent visits from the superintendents. Membership was down across the state due to the poor economy. Some churches requested not to have a minister appointed and instead asked "to be supplied" because they could not afford a ministerial salary. In 1936 the church at Prescott had lost half its members and chose to merge with the M.E. Church, South congregation. The churches at Gadsden, Cochise, and McNary closed. By 1939, the situation had recovered a little and membership across the state was increasing. The reports at the last session of the Southern California Conference showed a membership of 5,999 with 27 churches in Arizona across the two split districts.

### **Southern Methodism in Arizona**

The Los Angeles Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South was split from the Pacific Annual Conference in 1870 and would cover southern and central California. The first annual session was held October 26-30, 1870 at San Bernardino, California. The committee on missions in their report recommended sending a missionary to the territory of Arizona. The report was approved, and provisions were made for the support of the new work. Bishop William M. Wightman appointed Rev. Alexander Groves as the first missionary. "Almost immediately the reverend gentleman set out for Prescott, Arizona, the future field of this labors. He made the journey across the desert from California on horseback... After reaching Arizona he rested a few days in the Phoenix Settlement, before proceeding to Prescott." The weekend of December 17-18, Rev. Grove and Rev. Gilmore of the M.E. Church held services together at the Yavapai county courthouse. Rev. Groves advertised in Prescott's *Arizona Miner* on January 28, 1871: "The First Quarterly Conference of the Arizona Circuit of the M.E. Church, South will be held at Prescott, on the first Saturday and Sabbath of February." On February 4-5 the meeting took place, with preaching on each day and a church was organized. A lot was secured, and construction began in June. When Rev. Groves left for California in October to attend Annual Conference, the building was still not completed. After Conference, he went to Phoenix, leaving the congregation and unfinished church in Prescott to languish. The M.E. Church had bought lots next to the uncompleted M.E. Church, South on Marina Street and in December 1873 the church was sold to them. Thus, the first Protestant church building in Arizona, begun in 1871, had changed denominations and was not completed until 1875.

In November 1871, Rev. Groves settled in at Phoenix. There he found Rev. J. Franklin McKean had continued the work started the year before. In May 1872 the two "organized the first informal group of Southern Methodist for the purpose of fostering religious effort in this locality, then but a sparsely settled country." By March 1873 there were four preaching places in the Salt River valley: Phoenix, East Phoenix, Hayden's Ferry (Tempe) and Mesquite. At the 1873 annual meeting of the Los Angeles Conference, Arizona with its two circuits was designated the Arizona District, with Rev. Groves appointed the first Presiding Elder. The entire district had 20 members.

Expansion of the work of the M.E. Church, South in Arizona was slow. A successful revival in 1874 held on the outskirts of Phoenix raised the funds for the M.E. Church, South to purchase a permanent revival ground just

outside the then city limits (today located at 10th Street and McDowell Rd.). The camp meetings and revivals held there would lead to many conversions over the next decades. It was also not until 1874 when a third charge pointed was created in the Arizona District. Though the charge at Tucson was created that year, it was only supplied for a brief period in 1876, before the minister there, Rev. William Monk, "...decided that work at Tucson was not worth while and went to help Groves... in the... mountainous Northern Arizona." That work at Tucson was given up the next year. The majority of work in Arizona was focused at Phoenix and its surrounding areas and at Prescott. Though Prescott languished for several years without a regular minister.

The M.E. Church, South did not have the same level of funding that the Arizona Mission of the M.E. Church received, nor did the Los Angeles Conference have many ministers to send to Arizona. The early ministers had to find some other way to support themselves and their work. "In order to earn his living, [Rev. Groves] has located a ranch on the Tempe, where he works hard during the week, and walks to his appointments, being too poor to have a horse... In addition to this, he occasionally takes a contract to work or hires out." Many ministers homesteaded or purchased farms or ranches, while others had side professions. This led many of the ministers settled in Arizona permanently, avoiding the high personnel turn over that plagued the work of the M.E. Church. It cannot be stated enough the self-sacrifice that the early ministers endured to ensure the word of God reached the people of Arizona. One minister, Rev. L. J. Hedgpeth, even mortgaged his farm in Phoenix to pay for the building of a church.

In October 1875 that Rev. Lewis J. Hedgpeth was sent to Arizona. He would minister to the people of Arizona for the rest of his life. The work at Prescott was revived in February 1876, with Rev. Hedgpeth and Rev. McKean holding two straight weeks of services. The ladies of the church were instrumental in leading a building campaign, with work starting in June and the first service in the West Side church being held on December 24, 1876, though the building was not fully complete until January 1878. The church at Phoenix was completed about the same time. A lot there, at the corner of Center (Central) and Monroe, had been purchased for \$1 in August 1875. The following year an adobe building was started, being completed two years later and was the first church built in Phoenix.

At the Annual Conference in 1876, Rev. Hedgpeth was appointed the Arizona District Presiding Elder. Rev. Groves would continue to serve in Arizona until 1880, when he took an honorable location – he was simply worn out from a decade of missionary work in a rough field. He would continue serving as needed as a supply pastor over the next eight years. Rev. Hedgpeth would also take an honorable location to recover his health and finances before being readmitted. There was never a break in his service, as he continued as a supply pastor when needed. Rev. Hedgpeth's descendants continue to serve in the Desert Southwest today. A story shared by one shows the unique challenges of ministering in Arizona: Rev. Hdgpeth wrote "If [I] dwell on the terrors of hell in summer, [my] people would say, 'Let us try anything once,' while sermons on the joys of heaven in winter would elicit the observation, 'But look what we have here!'"

A Union Camp Meeting was held on April 8, 1875 at Hayden's Ferry (Tempe), with Reverends Groves and William Shaw of the M.E. Church, South and Rev. Reeder, Gilmore, Wright, and G. M. Herritt of the M.E. Church. From the start, the two Methodist denominations working in Arizona decided early on to support each other in their work. By gentlemen's agreement, they would not compete in the field, including not starting new works in a town where the other denomination was already present unless the population could support multiple churches. Several churches were exchanged when it was felt that the other denomination could better work the field. In 1916 San Simon M.E. Church went to the M.E. Church, South in exchange for the churches at Cochise and Kansas Settlement. The same agreement occurred again the next year, with churches at Safford and Littleton (Avondale) going to the M.E. Church, South in exchange for those at Ajo and Willcox. The churches received by the Los Angeles Conference prospered under their new management, with First UMC of Safford continuing to serve today.

1884 was the first year that more than two ministers served in Arizona for the entire year, with Rev. George T. Nichols appointed to Presiding Elder and the Phoenix circuit, Rev. James S. Chapman at Phoenix (Central), Rev. John M. Langston at Prescott, and Rev. Lewis J. Hedgpeth supplying the Tempe and Salt River circuit. The third M.E. Church, South was organized at Osborn school outside Phoenix. A Sunday school had begun meeting there in 1881. On March 11, 1885 the church was organized by Rev. George T. Nichols, the Presiding Elder, with fourteen members. It would be renamed as Bethel Church. That church, as well as societies at Wilson schoolhouse (near present-day Sky Harbor airport), and Double Buttes school house (Tempe), formed the Phoenix circuit. Tempe was

organized as a church in 1887. When the church was destroyed by a fire in 1913, the congregation voted not to rebuild and instead merged into the Tempe M.E. Church.

In 1890, after twenty years of work in Arizona, the M.E. Church, South reported five churches and seven charge points being served by a Presiding Elder and four other ministers. Several more societies had been created that would eventually grow into churches. Many of the barriers faced by the Arizona Mission were also affecting their southern Methodist brethren, such as a male dominated, transient population that would rather frequent the many saloons than the church meeting. Other times men were kept at work on Sundays, not allowing them the opportunity to attend a service. Rev. "Groves particularly had some heated arguments over this. More than once he held a church service by himself to protest Sabbath employment." The next decade would see slow growth of the work of the Los Angeles Conference in Arizona. Many of the societies or charge points on circuits were upgraded to churches. This included organizing the societies at Clifton (1894) and Camp Verde (1895) as churches or stations. The 1896 session of the Los Angeles Annual Conference was held at Central M.E. Church, South in Phoenix October 22-26. Central was the third largest church in the Conference, with 153 members, though if combined with the Phoenix Circuit (which included Bethel), the membership stood at 296 souls and the second largest membership group behind Trinity M.E. Church, South in Los Angeles. With a third of the church members in Arizona, it was justified to hold Annual Conference in that territory. Central also host annual Conferences in 1909, 1912, 1916 and 1921.

Entering the first decade of the new century, the Arizona District of the Los Angeles Conference had become concerned about its slow growth. Rev. James E. Crutchfield was appointed Presiding Elder of the District in 1907. He felt himself underqualified but had "a burning zeal to plant our church in every community of the territory." In 1907 he found only 507 members in seven churches and helped institute a Church Extension Plan to encourage development. Plan members, almost 100 in number, pledged to give at least five dollars each for every new church that would be built. This led to new churches organized at Cartwright in Phoenix (1906), Bowie (1907), Parker (1908), San Simon (1908), Willcox (1908), Liberty (1909), and Duncan (1909). A decade later (1918), the membership in the Arizona District had risen to 1,694 members with eight new church buildings erected.

Arizona achieved statehood in 1912. The Crutchfield family would play a prominent role in the state, with Rev. James E. Crutchfield serving as a member of the Arizona Constitutional Convention in 1910. He would also serve as chaplain of the Arizona State House of Representatives starting in 1926. "The last of 15 churches he established across the state, [was] known as Ola Crutchfield Memorial in Phoenix," organized in 1953 and named in honor of his late wife. His father, Rev. Seaborn Crutchfield, served as a retired supply in Arizona and as chaplain of the first session (1912) of the State Senate and as chaplain for the second through eighth sessions (1913-1919) of the State House of Representatives. More churches were added to the Los Angeles Conference after Arizona's statehood, including those at Morenci (1914), Claypool (1920), and Cottonwood (1920). In the last years of the Los Angeles Conference, three more churches were added in Arizona at Ft. Thomas (1921), Ray (1921), and University in Tucson (1922).

As early as 1889, there was the idea of splitting the Los Angeles Conference along state lines, with Arizona becoming its own conference. The distance between southern California and Arizona, along with the difficulties in travel made their joint administration difficult. The two areas also had different populations and needs. A resolution was introduced at the 1889 Annual Conference: "We, the Arizona District Conference of the M. E. Church, South, do most respectfully memorialize that the Los Angeles Annual Conference concur with us in memorializing the next General Conference to form the District of Arizona into a separate Annual Conference." The Annual Conference voted to send the resolution to General Conference, but nothing came of the request. Again, at the 1921 meeting of the Los Angeles Annual Conference, a resolution was passed, asking General Conference to split Los Angeles into two. This time an enabling act was passed at the 1922 General Conference, allowing Arizona to form its own conference. California churches in the former Los Angeles Conference would merge into the Pacific Conference.

### The Arizona Conference

The first meeting of the Arizona Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South was held October 25-29, 1922 at Central M.E. Church, South in Phoenix. The Conference was set up with three districts:

Phoenix, Tucson and Safford, though the last only existed for one year. The boundaries included "the state of Arizona and the town of Needles in California." At the organizing Conference there were reported 22 ministerial members, with 2,834 church members across 20 churches. For the next year, there were 31 charges listed, with 5 left to be supplied.

During the second annual meeting in 1922 a letter was received from 18 members of the Bisbee M.E. Church requesting a minister from the M.E. Church, South be sent to the city. The Tucson District Presiding Elder, Rev. Dr. William J. Sims, made a visit, meeting with the disgruntled members. He urged them to "not act hastily and under the heat of disagreement," refusing "to take any steps that would widen the breach." Six weeks later, another letter arrived telling of worsening conditions and again requesting a Southern Methodist minister to attend the people of Bisbee. Rev. Sims made another visit and found the situation had deteriorated and "so to conserve our Methodist membership, I appointed... [a] pastor... We refused to build in Bisbee so went to Warren." Thus Bisbee came to be the fourth town to host both Methodist denominations.

The first four years of the Annual Conference recorded an encouraging growth. Eight churches had been organized: Bowels Memorial (Grace) in Phoenix in 1922, and in 1923 at Apache, Trinity in Warren (Bisbee), Casa Grande, Mayer, Peoria, Capitol in Phoenix, Scottsdale, and Menlo Park in Tucson. Additionally, 15 church buildings were erected, purchased, or improved upon and nine parsonages were added.

At the 1926 General Conference an offer was sent to the body to make certain gifts of land, buildings, and other financial considerations in connection with a hospital in Tucson. The offer was presented by Rev. James L. Lyons. A commission was appointed, and the offer referred there, and with the commission having the power to act on it. Established in 1906 as the private Whitwell Hospital, it had most recently operated as a tuberculosis sanitorium, but came with a debt. The final decision in 1927 was to purchase the hospital through bonds. The Southern Methodist Hospital and Sanitorium incorporated January 12, 1927. At the time, it was the only tuberculosis operating in Tucson. Unfortunately, two years later in October 1929 the Great Depression gripped the world. The Southern Methodist Hospital never operated at a profit, and the mounting debt that came with the purchase and operations of the hospital began to be a major issue. In 1938 the hospital was sold to pay its creditors. Today the property is known as the Castle Apartments.

The Great Depression greatly affected the churches of the Arizona Conference. The only church organized during that time was at Avondale in 1936. Churches were closed at Beardsley, Clifton, Wittmann, Humboldt, Mayer, Apache and Cottonwood. The final report of the Arizona Annual Conference in 1939 listed a membership of 5,309 across 28 congregations. The two Methodist denominations in Arizona enjoyed equal success and would continue to grow with the population.

### Methodism in Southern Nevada

The Mojave Desert and Great Basin Desert cover the majority of southern Nevada. Few settlements existed in this landscape until the Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad crossed it in 1905. Owners of the railroad created Las Vegas as a mid-point on the line and held a townsite auction on May 15, 1905. In an effort to promote morality, one of the owners, William Clark, wrote to Rev. John Wesley Bain, urging him to come to Las Vegas and establish a church. Rev. and Mrs. Bain arrived in June to find that several local women had already organized a Sunday school several months earlier. The first service was held on June 11, 1905 in the tent school. Las Vegas Methodist Episcopal Church was chartered on June 18, 1905 with sixteen members and was part of the Nevada Mission of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

For the first few years Las Vegas was a town of tents, and the church quickly outgrew them all. The railroad donated a lot at Third and Bridger Streets, with construction beginning in December 1907 and being completed December 6, 1908. When the school was destroyed by fire in 1910, desks were placed in the church and classes conducted there for the rest of the year. When a fire destroyed the church in January 1922, they met in the schoolhouse until a new church was completed in 1923. The Nevada Mission was dissolved in 1917, with the church in Las Vegas joining the Southern California Conference and the rest of the churches joining the California Conference.

The second Methodist church in Las Vegas was organized in November 1917. Rev. Jesse L. Collins was among the many African American settlers who had come to the desert because of the railroad. He established the

Zion Rest Mission with fourteen members, meeting in homes. In the spring of 1918, Zion Methodist Episcopal Church held a patriotic social to raise funds for a church building and aid members of the black community serving in the armed forces. For many years Rev. Collins served Zion, with support from the ministers at First. However, no pastor was officially assigned to the church (it was not even named as a charge) until 1938. Rev. Ford Gilbert of First Church persuaded the Conference and the General Board of Missions to aid the church in obtaining and funding a pastor. In March 1939, Pastor Andrew M. Brantford arrived. Sadly, he died on June 11, 1939. Mrs. Wreatha Brandford finished her husband's appointment. Over the next 20 years, Zion was served by a series of lay and local pastors, with support from First. In 1960 Rev. Marion D. Bennett was appointed. He would serve the church for the next 44 years. As Zion began their 100th year, a devastating fire on June 6, 2017 destroyed the sanctuary. Zion UMC has vowed to rise from the ashes and rebuild.

Congress passed the Swinger-Johnson bill authorizing the construction of a Dam along the Colorado River, though no money was appropriated until 1931. Because of the Great Depression, thousands came to Las Vegas in the hopes of working on the dam construction, setting up tent and cardboard settlements. The First and Zion M.E. Churches and the four others in Las Vegas contributed food and clothing to those in need. The construction camp for the dam became Bullhead City. A church was organized there in 1947 and today is known as Hope UMC. The northern most church was organized at Caliente, Nevada and chartered on November 11, 1945 as Community Methodist Church.

Thanks to a grant in 1958 from the Department of the Interior, First Methodist Church of Las Vegas acquired a large campsite on Potosi Mountain, outside of Las Vegas. Church members cleared the site, transported a building up the mountain, dug wells and helped establish and operate Potosi Pines Camp. The church oversaw the camp until 1982, when it was transferred to the Conference.

The Las Vegas area continued to grow with the influx of residents creating a need for church expansion. Several times, membership of First Church was split over staying at their present location or moving to a suburban area. Each time, the church chose to stay at their present location and aid in the purchasing of land for a new church start. These new churches included Griffith MC (1954), Trinity MC (1963), Wesley MC in North Las Vegas (1965) and University MC (1966). Las Vegas experienced another growth in the 1980s that continues to this day. During that period, more churches were organized, including a Korean ministry (1986), Advent UMC (1988), Sunrise Mountain UMC (1988), Desert Spring UMC (1991), Celebration! UMC (1996), and Hispanic ministries. A Tongan ministry was added in 2009. On November 17, 1996, United Methodist Historic Site marker no. 340 was dedicated in recognition of the significant ministries of First United Methodist Church of Las Vegas through the last century. The church buildings were also placed on the National Register of Historic Places. By 2003, the decline in membership meant that First UMC could no longer be sustained, and the membership voted to merge with another UM church. The historic property in downtown Las Vegas was sold. The memories live on in former members, the historical records of the church, and through the many churches created.

## Hispanic Work

The Methodist Episcopal Church, South began work among the Spanish speaking population in Arizona in 1886 when Rev. John F. Corbin was appointed to the Sonora circuit, part of the Mexico Border Mission. One of the preaching places he chose was Nogales, straddling the border between the U.S. and Mexico. A charge point was created there in 1888, supplied by Rev. John A. Wright, who was serving the English-speaking congregation in the town. The next years saw a Hispanic minister supplying the church, with a full-time minister appointed in 1891. The Nogales "Mexican" church, today known as El Mesias Iglesia Methodista, is the oldest Spanish-language church in the Desert Southwest Conference.

The Mexico Border Mission was restructured in 1890, with the new Northwest Mexico Mission Conference serving northern Mexican, Arizona, New Mexico, and El Paso, Texas. The second eldest Spanish-language church in the Desert Southwest is Primera Iglesia Methodista, organized in south Phoenix. Rev. Esau P. Muñoz, who served the church in the 1930s, shared the story of the beginning of Primera Iglesia:

*"Era una naciente ciudad. Habia ya, para ese tiemp, una Iglesia Metodista americana con su templo en la esquina de las calles Monroe y Central. Frecuentemente predicaban al aire libre, a donde acudian los curiosos para saber lo que creian los protestantes. "Esto ocurria antes del año 1890... Una familia de*

*apellido Orozco... que vivia segregada del pueblo, cerca de lo que ahora es la Avenida 15, venia frecuentemente a oir los Protestantes. Entre ellos venia Don José, el padre del Antonio y Roman, otros hermanos y aignas muchachas, y Manuel Arenas, Los misioneros, viendo la asiduidad de los Orozco, los apersonaron con un visitante de apellido Elliott quien resulto ser obrero Metodista que venia de un lugar de Sur American y que hablaba español."*

[Paraphrasing him:] Phoenix Station, today's Central UMC, frequently preached in the open air, with the curious listening in to find out what the Protestants believed. This happened before the year 1890. The Orozco family, who lived near today's 15th Avenue, often came to hear the Protestants. Central Church, seeing the interest from the Spanish speaking residents of Phoenix, invited Rev. [Robert C.] Elliott, a Methodist missionary from South American to come. Rev. Elliott organized a church on January 10, 1892. Land was donated and the congregation built an adobe church on the site.

The work among the Hispanic population in Arizona was gradually expanding. In 1902 the churches at Nogales and Phoenix were expanded into circuits, serving the communities along the border and in the Salt River valley. Work was reported in later years at Tempe and Patagonia. The 1914 General Conference of the M.E. Church, South formed the Pacific Mexican Mission which covered the Mexican states of Sonora, Sinaloa, Tepic and Baja California, and the Mexican work in Arizona and California. They "recognized that people immigrating from Mexico to the United States in revolutionary times could best be served by a church conference working both sides of the border." Little information is known for the years 1914-1917 as "[b]ecause of war disturbances, the Mission held no meeting." Those appointed to charges that spanned the U.S.-Mexican border were often unable to cross to one church or the other. Some churches were in areas that were under active military action and all services were suspended. Nogales came under attack several times, as did other border towns. At the 1918 session of General Conference, the Pacific Mexican Mission was dissolved. The Western Mexican Mission was formed and included the states of Arizona, U.S. and Sonora, Mexico. Following the end of the Mexican Revolution, new work was reported in 1919 at Ray, Hayden, and Sonora in Arizona.

A "day school" formed at Nogales in 1919, and another at Phoenix in 1920: "John F. Corbin School is conducted in Phoenix, Arizona, under the auspices of the Home Department of the Board of Missions of the MECS. At present kindergarten instruction only is given, but the plans include the development of the school into a grade school. The school was opened January 5, 1920." Both schools were short-lived, only operating one year.

The 1920s and 1930s experienced the biggest growth in missionary work, with 1922 listing new charges at Miami, Nogales, Phoenix, Sonora-Hayden, Tempe, and Tucson. More work was added in the last years of the Western Mexican Conference at Superior in 1927, Claypool in 1929, Scottsdale in 1930, Prescott in 1931. With unification in 1939, all of the Hispanic churches in Arizona were moved under the Latin American Mission of the Methodist Church.

The New Mexico Mission of the Methodist Episcopal Church was organized in 1872, with Rev. Thomas Harwood of the Colorado Conference serving as Superintendent. When he arrived in New Mexico, he found the primary language of the land to be Spanish, which he did not speak a word of. The work among the Hispanic population was organized as the New Mexico Spanish Mission in 1885 with Rev. Harwood, who now spoke the language fluently, at the helm. He would devote the rest of his life to ministering to the Spanish speaking populations of New Mexico, Arizona and northern Mexico. The Mission expanded into Arizona when Rev. David Alva was appointed to Tucson in 1890. The next year Rev. Maximo Ortega added Solomonville, Arizona to his Silver City, New Mexico circuit. By 1900 many of the southern Arizona mining towns were listed under the appointments, though most were left to be supplied. Intermittent work was reported at Clifton, Metcalf, Morenci, Douglas, Naco, and Bisbee with other charges at Solomonville-Sanchez, Tucson-Magdalena, and at Yuma. "The need for work among the Mexicans in Arizona was apparently not lost on the... leadership" of the Arizona Mission, M.E. Church. "But despite the recognition of the need and opportunity, apparently most of the efforts, save for establishing a school for 'Spanish girls' in Tucson in 1908, went toward organizing English-speaking congregations."

The school reference was the Mary J. Platt Industrial School, which was established in 1911 by the Women's Home Missionary Society of the M.E. Church. It provided Christian training for Mexican and Mexican American girls, with focus on learning the domestic arts. The school was started in a rented house and later a purpose-built

school was constructed in the Rincon Heights neighborhood of Tucson. Originally operating as a day school, it later hosted boarding students. The Mary J. Platt School closed its doors in 1928.

In 1905, "under the guidance of missionaries [Rev. Leandro Fernandez and Rev. Dionicio Costales], an adobe chapel was built along the banks of Gila River" near Sanchez. When the chapel was destroyed by a flood in 1918, the work was discontinued until a schoolhouse was built, then services resumed. At Douglas, Methodist services were first led by lay persons and held in private homes. The first Methodist ministers appointed to the Douglas-Nacoziari circuit were Rev. Epigmenio Flores in 1905 and Rev. Dionicio Costales in 1907. By 1917 the congregation was "large enough to build a regular meeting place." In 1920, led by Rev. John Burman, a larger church was built and the original building became the parsonage. Rev. Charles W. Ports, a missionary who had previously served in South America, was appointed to Douglas in 1922. When he died in 1933, his wife, Mrs. Clara R. Ports, took up the pulpit. She became the second woman in Arizona to be appointed to a charge. El Divino Salvador would continue to serve the Hispanic community of Douglas until its discontinuation in 2010.

At the 1920 General Conference of the M.E. Church the Latin American Mission was created: "The resident Bishop of the San Francisco Area is authorized to organize the Latin American Mission which shall include the Mexicans and other Spanish speaking people, Portuguese, Italians, and French in lower [Baja] California, the States of California, Nevada and that part of the State of Arizona lying west of the parallel of the longitude 112 degrees west." Rev. Vernon M. McCombs was appointed Superintendent of the Mission. At this time, only the Salt River circuit (Mesa-Tempe) and a "Western Arizona" circuit were part of the Latin American Mission. The rest of Hispanic M.E. Churches in Arizona remained in the Southwest Spanish Mission, not transferring to the Latin American Mission until 1932. When the Arizona churches joined the Latin American Mission there were only four Hispanic charges: Salt River circuit (Mesa), Douglas, Northern Arizona circuit (Flagstaff), and Jerome.

Mesa Mexican M.E. Church was organized about 1920 and supplied by Missionary Alma H. Blew. She was the first woman appointed to serve a charge in Arizona. Rev. Ismael Delgado arrived in 1926 as the first full-time pastor but served less than a year, leaving Pastor Blew to work the Salt River circuit alone. She would continue to serve at Mesa, often without the help of a minister, until the 1940s. Following integration in 1956, the Mesa Hispanic church was merged in First Church of Mesa.

A circuit covering northern Arizona was organized in 1915, with preaching points at Flagstaff, Williams, and Winslow. Not much headway was made until 1922, when Rev. John Burman was appointed to the circuit. He organized a church at Flagstaff, later named El Divino Redentor, and continued to serve the surrounding communities. The church purchased the old Presbyterian Church in Flagstaff, occupying it until 2003 when El Divino Redentor Iglesia Methodista Unida was discontinued.

Jerome Mexican M.E. Church was organized in 1926. The congregation was denied the use of the white Methodist church in town and had to find some other place to meet. They were able to acquire land and set about building a church. Led by Pastor Sabino González, construction was started by the congregation in 1939 using stucco, wire mesh, and disassembled wooden blasting powder boxes from the local mines. The church was completed in 1941 and used until the Hispanic churches were integrated in 1956. Today the "Powder Box Church" still stands as a private home.

In his 1930 report, Rev. W. A. Betts, Arizona District Superintendent (Southern California Conference, M.E. Church) wrote: "The one dark spot in Arizona Methodism is to be found in the lack of vision and coordination of our ecclesiastical machinery and missionary money in the interests of our Mexican and Indian population. If the Conferences involved do not stop quibbling over territorial rights, and give someone on the ground a free hand and financial support in caring for the helpless but lovable people, Methodism will have to answer for her neglect." Work amongst the Hispanic population in Arizona did increase in the 1940s.

After unification of the Methodist denomination in 1939, all of the work among the Hispanic populations of southern California, Arizona, and southern Nevada was brought under the Latin American Mission of the Methodist Church. This also marked the end of the missionary era for Hispanic work in the western US. "Latino ministers and lay people were demanding a greater voice in running conference, district and congregational affairs in their communities." The Latin American Provisional Conference was organized in 1941 with a designation that Hispanic ministers would be district superintendents and hold the positions of Director of Christian Education and Executive Secretary of the Epworth League. However, "the use of Spanish language to conduct conference business

was denied. Hispanic pastors, formerly members of the Southern California-Arizona Conference, now became members of the new Conference and could exercise self-determination.” The new Provisional Conference included 11 charges with 20 preaching places in Arizona. Rev. McCombs remained as General Superintendent with an Anglo Assistant General Superintendent. It was not until his retirement in 1946 and the appointment of Luis P. Tierre that a Latino helmed the Latin American Conference.

The 1948 General Conference authorized the Latin American Provisional Conference to integrate with the Southern California-Arizona and California-Nevada Conferences at the latter’s discretion. Before that could happen, it was desired to increase the salaries and pensions of Hispanic ministers needed to be at least 80% of that of the Anglo Conferences. By the mid-1950s “the poor economic situation made it impossible to continue” the Latin American Conference. “Instead of the concept of two uniting groups, the idea of integration was introduced and voted upon affirmatively.” Bishop Gerard Kennedy had appointed a Committee on Integration in the fall of 1952 and they made their report at the 1953 Annual Conference. The committee recommended full integration by June 1956.

Twelve towns across Arizona had two Methodist churches: an English-speaking congregation and a Spanish-language or “Mexican” congregation. “There were efforts to assimilate Hispanics into Anglo churches, but this often became a denial of Hispanic culture. There was membership loss and anxiety about the future of Hispanic” Methodism. When the Latin American Mission Conference was merged into the Southern California-Arizona Conference in 1956, the support for dual congregations ended. Several of the Hispanic churches merged into the English-speaking congregations in the 1950s, while others simply closed. Only in one instance did the English church merge into the Hispanic church: at Nogales, where First Church merged into the larger and stronger congregation of El Mesisas Methodist Iglesia. Across the Conference, Hispanic membership dropped, a downward trend that has yet to be reversed.

### **First Unification: The Methodist Church**

At the Uniting Conference in Kansas City, on May 8, 1939, the Methodist Episcopal Church, the Methodist Episcopal Church, South and the Methodist Protestant Church merged to form the Methodist Church. On June 28, 1939 the Southern California Conference of Methodist Episcopal Church met for the last time at First Presbyterian Church in Long Beach and declared the Conference dissolved. The same day, the Arizona Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South met at Moore Memorial Church in Long Beach to conclude its business and dissolve. That evening the two conferences joined together at the first meeting of the Southern California-Arizona Conference, held at the Long Beach Civil Auditorium. The new Conference covered southern California, southern Nevada, and Arizona. The 54 churches in Arizona plus Bard, California formed the Arizona District. The two Nevada churches, First and Zion, as well as Needles and Blythe, California were part of the Pasadena District. Additionally there was the Los Angeles District and the San Diego District. Three of the strongest churches in the new Conference were located in Arizona: First Church in Tucson and First Church in Phoenix (M.E. Churches) and Central Church (M.E. Church, South) in Phoenix. Though the two former Methodist denominations had prospered equally in Arizona, the same could not be said in southern California. There the former M.E. Church was dominant there. After unification, the memory of the work done by the M.E. Church, South faded and many of the recorders were lost, including those for Arizona.

The unification of the two Methodist denominations in Arizona created several conundrums. In Phoenix, Central (a former M.E. Church, South) is actually older than First Church (the first M.E. Church). In Tucson, two churches were located only a block from one another: First Church (formerly First M.E. Church) and University Church (formerly a M.E. Church, South). As University was the younger church, they were given two options: merge with First or relocated. The church decided to relocate. In 1943 they had sponsored a new church start in the Catalina neighborhood of Tucson. University sold their property a block from the University of Arizona and moved all to the Catalina Mission site. Today the church is known as Catalina UMC.

World War II brought a large influx of people to Arizona and southern Nevada. First the military came and set up bases, airfields and training grounds. Families soon followed their soldiers. Then the factories came, making those items necessary for the war effort. More people came, looking for work and other opportunities. Then those of Japanese descent living on the Pacific coast were forced into camps, including those at Poston and Gila River in

Arizona. Among those forced into internment were Methodist ministers of Japanese descent. The Pacific Japanese Mission appointed those pastors to the camps, allowing them to continue under appointment during the war. Local churches in Arizona helped give support as allowed. Rev. George McClure of Parker would serve as a volunteer chaplain at Poston giving "witness to what most people turned their backs on." Arizona District Superintendent Rev. Paul F. Huebner wrote in his 1943 report, "Arizona Methodism believes there will be a world tomorrow, a world of more creative life and opportunity for all people, whatever their race or color. Arizona Methodism pledges itself anew to God in the fulfillment of this purpose under God." Churches throughout Arizona and southern Nevada gave use of their fellowship halls as U.S.O. centers. "Bishop James Baker came through Parker and visited the Methodist Church unannounced, to find 'dancing, card playing and carrying on' at the busy USO in the Fellowship Hall." Times were changing for the Methodists.

The war drew many young men into service, with ministers enlisting as chaplains or being drafted into the armed forces. The need to fill pulpits allowed many women the opportunity a calling that had previously been denied to them. The first women to be appointed to charges served the Hispanic congregations of Arizona in the 1930s. The next group of women to be under appointment included: Mrs. Susan Kernahan, wife and mother of ministers, knew it was now her time to lead. She was appointed to fill the pulpit in October 1942 at Creighton Methodist Church in Phoenix. She would serve there until 1951, when she was transferred to churches in California. After her retirement in 1960, she served as an associate pastor at Central Methodist Church in Phoenix. Pastor Helen Toner was a licensed local pastor from New York who came to Arizona for health reasons. She started as secretary at First Church of Tucson before being appointed to Gilbert in 1943. Soon after she arrived, the church was deemed unsafe and condemned. Pastor Toner rallied the congregation and led the church through the only successful building program conducted during World War II. Bertha May White was consecrated a deaconess in 1936, as that was the only type of ministry open to her at that time. She came to Arizona in 1938 to serve the Hispanic migrant and rural communities. In 1943 she was appointed the Director of Christian Education at Flagstaff Federated Church and in 1945 she took over the pulpits for Ash Fork and Seligman. She went on to serve at Clarkdale-Jerome, Somerton, and at Catalina, Pueblo Gardens and St. John's in Tucson. Bertha May became the first woman to be ordained a deacon by the Southern California-Arizona Conference in 1955; she became an Associate Member when that option became available in 1969. Gertrude M. Parker was a deaconess and local pastor. She came to Arizona and took up the pastorate at Parker in September 1945. She and her partner, fellow Deaconess Elizabeth "Lizzie" Curry who kept the parsonage, would go on to serve at Ash Fork-Seligman and several churches in California. In 1965 Pastor Parker was sent to supply the Silver Bell Federated Church, in a dying mining town. Instead of closing the church as instructed, she grew the membership. These early women ministers helped pave the way for full ordination in the years to come.

Post-World War II saw the population explosion continue in Arizona and southern Nevada. Rev. Roscoe Strivings arrived in Arizona in early 1948 to serve as a Mobile Missionary. He organized five churches, with the fifth being Aldersgate in Phoenix. In 1948 the Valley Methodist Missionary and Church Extension Society was created with the mission of promoting and helping finance the work of the Methodist Church in the Phoenix area. By 1951 it became apparent that the Society's services were needed state-wide and its name was changed to the Arizona Methodist Church Extension Society. The Society helped set up escrow accounts, held titles to new property, and aided in the financing of new churches. The Bishop's Prospector's Fund also provided for the purchase of new sites for church plants. Many of the churches started in the 1950s and 1960s were begun as such: land was bought in a developing area, a minister was found, and a new church was planted. To understand the phenomenal growth during this period:

The Conference had grown so large, that additional districts needed to be created. In 1955 the Tri-State District was created, covering southern Nevada, Needles, and some northern Arizona churches. The Arizona District was split in 1961 into the Phoenix District and the Tucson District, bringing the total number of districts in the Conference to nine.

Outdoor recreation and camping for leisure boomed in the post-war years. Thus camp and retreat ministries expanded to fill the demand. There had been Methodist owned camps in Arizona before, with the Los Angeles Conference, M.E. Church, South owning one in the Pinal Mountains in southern Arizona. The Arizona Conference sold that camp and rented another near Prescott. A camp fund was launched in February 1946 and authorized a search for an ideal camp site in Arizona. In 1947 the Southern California-Arizona Conference purchased a 121-acre cattle ranch on the top of Mingus Mountain. Work camps were organized to provide the manpower to build many of the original buildings and most of the work was paid for through fund raising drives and donations. Cabins were moved up the mountain from Jerome and arrived on trucks, brought up from Phoenix. The craft cabin was rebuilt from the original homestead in 1953, a dining hall was completed in 1956, and a director's home added in 1972. More cabins and building have been added in subsequent years. Today Mingus Mountain Camp welcomes hundreds of guests year-round. A second camp was acquired in 1952 with the purchase of Pinery Canyon camp. The site had been developed in 1946 by the Tucson YMCA and University-Catalina Methodist Church and was located in the Chiricahuas Mountains in southeast Arizona. The camp was moved in 1956 to a better location and renamed Pine Canyon Camp. After severe floods and a fire, it was decided to sell the camp. In 2009 the camp was deconsecrated and later sold. Potosi Pines Camp, ran by First Church of Las Vegas since 1958, was transferred to the Pacific & Southwest Conference in 1982.

A Christian Ministry in the National Parks program began at Yellowstone National Park in 1951, soon spreading to other parks. At the Grand Canyon National Park, the Grand Canyon Community Church joined the movement. The church had been organized about 1910 and has been served by itinerant ministers, including Methodist circuit riders from Flagstaff, Williams, and other northern points. A parsonage was acquired in 1947 and the first full-time minister arrived in the summer of 1948. Rev. Kenneth Porray, a Methodist minister became the first resident minister; he would serve until 1953. Methodist ministers would continue to supply the church until 1968. In the early 1950s fund raising started for a sanctuary. The inter-faith chapel, Shrine of the Ages, was completed in 1970.

Wesley House was created in 1950, providing community programs, services, classes, activities, meeting spaces, and more for the primarily Hispanic families residing in south-central Phoenix. For many years, the activities focused on adult English and citizenship activities. With the addition of a gymnasium in the 1970s, more programs were provided for children and youth, continuing that emphasis through 2016. Mother/Baby clinics were added in the 1970s, with the healthcare priority becoming more extensive in 2002. Centro de Salud health center began with volunteer physicians, primarily from the Banner Good Samaritan Hospital, who offered services to the uninsured. The Wesley Health Center opened a second site in 2016 at the Golden Gate Community Center. The Wesley Community and Health Center's mission of "Together We Empower Positive Change," is at the heart of all its programs.

By action of the 1956 Annual Conference, the School of Theology was in the processes of relocating from the University of Southern California to Claremont, California as part of the church's disaffiliation with USC. The University had been founded by the Southern California Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1880, with Maclay College of Theology moving to the campus in 1900. The new School of Theology at Claremont was an official theological school of the Methodist Church, and remains so to this day for the United Methodist Church.

The 1950 meeting of the Southern California-Arizona Annual Conference held at Redlands, California was the 100<sup>th</sup> session of a Methodist annual meeting in California. Bishop James C. Baker remained the resident bishop assigned to the Los Angeles Episcopal Area but invited Bishop Alexander P. Shaw to serve as Presiding Bishop over the session of Annual Conference. This was the first time that "a Negro Bishop presided over a predominantly Caucasian Conference." For most of the country, Methodism was a segregated church.

The Central Jurisdiction had been created by the 1939 unification of the three Methodist denominations and codified segregation in the church. The Jurisdiction was based not on a geographical location, but instead included all African American conferences of the new denomination. It was not until the second unification in 1968 that the Central Jurisdiction was finally dissolved. Colorado was the only place in today's Western Jurisdiction that was a

part of the Central Jurisdiction. There were African American congregations throughout the rest of the west, with Zion (1917) in Las Vegas, Nevada and Wesley (1945) in south Phoenix, Arizona. These churches remained in the Southern California-Arizona Conference.

The *Mississippi Methodist Advocate* published a statement on January 2, 1963 that was signed by 28 pastors of the Mississippi Conference. Most were young and all were white and native Mississippians. The "Born of Conviction" statement called for freedom of the pulpit so that ministers might speak against injustice without fear of reprisal; included quotes from the *Book of Discipline*, including "all men are brothers" and "no discrimination because of race, color or creed;" expressed support for public school integration and opposition "to the diversion of tax funds to the support of private or sectarian schools"; and affirmed their "unflinching opposition to Communism." While there was some support for the statement, most of the response was outrage. Several of the pastors were immediately ousted by their congregations and others felt pressure to resign. Some churches passed resolutions stating that would not accept the appointment of any of the pastors. Twenty of the ministers transferred out of the Mississippi Conference, with eight going to the Southern California-Arizona Conference. Two of them were appointed to Arizona, with Rev. H. Bufkin Oliver going to Christ Chapel (Dayspring) in Tempe and Rev. Jack Troutman starting a new church in east Mesa that would grow to be Grace UMC.

At the 1963 Annual Conference, the Rev. Wilbur Johnson was appointed to Pueblo Gardens Methodist Church in Tucson, Arizona. Against tradition, Bishop Kennedy visited the church to privately announce the appointment and ask the congregation to vote on it. Pueblo Gardens unanimously approved. At the time, appointed were first made public as they were read out at Annual Conference. There was backlash and controversy as soon as the appointment was announced, both within the Church and across the nation. The reason: Rev. Johnson was African-American and Pueblo Gardens MC had an all-white congregation. Bomb threats were made against Rev. Johnson and the church. "Two members of the Pueblo Gardens Methodist Church told police yesterday that they received phone calls from an unidentified man who said, 'We will bomb the church tomorrow'..." While police were investigating the bomb threats several members of the congregation told them that they have been harassed by phone calls of an insulting nature..." Thankfully the threat was not carried out, though police were present. The church chose to stand united behind their new pastor, giving hope for future changes. At Rev. Johnson's first service, the congregation and many visitors attended in mass, about twice the usual attendance. This was the start of integration for the Southern California-Arizona Conference.

Churches and pastors across Arizona and southern Nevada supported their African American brethren through protests, boycotts, sit-ins, and other acts. In 1964 the Phoenix Chapter of the NAACP invited Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. to visit Arizona. Central Methodist Church, led by Rev. Kermit L. Long, was one of the sponsors of the event held on June 3 at Arizona State University.

In 1964 an urban ministry was started in Phoenix as the Inner-City Board of the Arizona Methodist Church Extension Society (AMCES). The early work of this faithful group was 'urban-centered ministries' that included relief for transients and backyard playgrounds for impoverished neighborhoods. The name was changed in 1973 to the Metropolitan Phoenix Commission (MEPCO). Another name change occurred in 1985, becoming the United Methodist Outreach Ministries (UMOM). UMOM's mission is to prevent and end homelessness with innovative strategies and housing solutions that meet the unique needs of each family and individual. On Christmas Eve 1987 UMOM answered the call from the Governor to manage an overflow emergency shelter. In 1992 UMOM opened the New Day Center family shelter in an old motel on Van Buren street in Phoenix. A merger with YWCA's Haven House in 2007 increased shelter capacity. UMOM moved to a new campus in 2009 that allowed for greater services. They expanded into offering affordable/supportive housing in Phoenix with Legacy Crossing, opening in 2010, providing services to military veterans and families in 2011, and the opening of Parson's Village in 2016. In 2017 the Bruce and Diane Halle Women's Center opened in Phoenix as the only shelter in Arizona solely for single women experiencing homelessness. That year UMOM took over the operations of Tumbleweed Center for Youth Development's programs and shelters, whose mission is "to serve abused, abandoned, trouble, and neglected youth in our community." UMOM "[b]egan in the hearts of people who knew they could do more for those who had less" and continues to serve that mission today.

The 1960s were a contentious time for the Methodist Church. In 1965 five inner-city churches in Phoenix, St. Paul's, Capitol, Primera Iglesia, Crutchfield Memorial, Wesley, and the Wesley Community Center, "formed a Group Ministry which [enabled] them to do together which no one could do separately." Ray MC closed in 1965

as the town was obliterated because of mining. The church building was moved to Kearney and became their new fellowship call, called Ray Hall.

### **The Evangelical United Brethren Church in Arizona**

The Evangelical United Brethren Church was formed in 1946 by a merger of the Church of the United Brethren and the Evangelical Church. The California Conference of the EUB Church expanded into Phoenix, Arizona in 1955. Incorporated as First Evangelical United Brethren Church of Phoenix on April 10, 1955. Rev. John S. Clayton was the founding pastor, with Rev. Homer H. Miller taking over during the second year. In 1957 Rev. David Lynch arrived and served for the next six years. After the 1968 merger of the EUB and Methodist Churches, it was renamed Albright United Methodist Church. In 2012 Albright UMC voted to merged with Creighton UMC and formed the Arcadia Cooperative Parish, being renamed The Bridge UMC. The former Albright campus was sold.

Bishop W. Maynard Sparks and Dr. O. E. Schafer of the California Conference authorized a study to be conducted in Phoenix west of the Black Canyon Highway (I-17) on the feasibility of starting a new congregation. A meeting was held at Encanto Park on May 28, 1963 and it was determined there was enough interest to proceed. The second EUB church started as a mission project of First EUB Church of Phoenix. Rev. Glen R. Peck was sent to First EUB to work on the mission project. The first services were held on July 14, 1963 in rented accommodations with 65 people in attendance. Mid-week services were held in various private homes. West Phoenix Evangelical United Brethren Church was incorporated on April 12, 1964 with 46 charter members. A parsonage was purchased the next month. Land was acquired on 51<sup>st</sup> Avenue just south of Thomas Road with a groundbreaking ceremony held on February 21, 1965. The building was completed and dedicated on July 18th. The mortgage was paid in full in 1971, ahead of schedule.

In a letter to the California Conference, the congregation of West Phoenix EUB Church expressed "complete disfavor" with the pending merger of the Methodist Church, citing theological differences and fear of losing their identity. After the merger, the church was renamed Desert West United Methodist Church. On January 6, 1980 Desert West and Margaret Brook Memorial United Methodist Churches merged together. "It was felt Brooks had outgrown its facilities and Desert West had not yet reached its potential growth." The new church was named Christ United Methodist Church. This church would merge again in 2004 with Avondale Community UMC. Located in Avondale, the church is now known as Christ Community United Methodist Church.

### **The United Methodist Church**

In 1968 the Methodist Church and the Evangelical United Brethren Church united to form the United Methodist Church. The Southern California-Arizona Conference remained and absorbed the EUB churches that were located within its boundaries. In Arizona, that included two churches in Phoenix. No EUB churches had been organized in southern Nevada.

Up through 1966 the Conference experienced a steady membership increase. However, after that date, there has been a membership decline even though there has been an increase in churches. Key 73 was a denomination-wide evangelistic program held in 1973-74. The program did little to help with the enrollment of children and youth across the Conference. The United Methodist Builders program was started in the Tucson District in 1977, with the first request for funds going to St. Matthew UMC in Mesa. The Nevada churches were moved in 1969 from the Phoenix District to the Riverside District.

Tucson Metropolitan Ministries, today known as TMM Family Services, was started in 1974 and serves the vulnerable populations in southern Arizona. Their main campus in Tucson was acquired in 1987 and provides transitional and affordable housing, along with three other apartment complexes in Marana, Thatcher and Willcox. Other services include a ReStore, Community Closet, and a 2017 partnership with the City of Tucson offering a whole home residential rehabilitation program. This vital ministry continues to serve its communities.

When the Hawaii Mission was merged into the Southern California-Arizona Conference, the Conference faced the issue of covering four states, but only having two in its name. In 1977 the Conference changed its name to the Pacific & Southwest Conference.

In November 1957 the Desert Crest retirement home opened in Phoenix, with a consecration service held in March 1958 with Rev. Kermit Long of Central presiding. The new facility became part of the Pacific Homes Corporation. By the late 1960s, Pacific Homes, with 14 retirement homes and convalescent hospitals in California, Arizona and Hawaii, was having financial problems. The homes proved to be "exceptionally good at taking care of the residents." As a result, the residents lived longer than expected and there was slower turnover. Pacific Homes wasn't getting enough new residents, and the existing tenants had already paid up on their "life care" contracts. The contracts hadn't been priced high enough, and inflation exacerbated the problem. No money was kept in reserve to protect against such changes. Pacific Homes filed for Chapter XI under the U.S. Bankruptcy Code on February 18, 1977, and the filing was converted to a Chapter X on November 4th. The lawsuits against the homes and church started when Pacific Homes asked the residents for money beyond their contractual obligations. Residents filed at least a half-dozen lawsuits in response. The lawsuits had denomination-wide consequences as the Pacific & Southwest Annual Conference, The United Methodist Church, and several of its agencies were named, including the General Commission of Finance and Administration (GCFA). An appeals court determined that the United Methodist Church was a legal entity that could be sued. *60 minutes* aired a segment interviewing Bishop Charles F. Golden of the Pacific & Southwest Conference and stirred up fears that the denomination might throw Pacific Homes residents out onto the street if they couldn't pay their fees. The cases were decided in 1980 and concluded that "the annual conference owned (the homes) lock, stock and barrel" and was financially responsible for them. During all of this, a new Bishop took over the Pacific & Southern Conference in 1980. Bishop Jack Tuell made pastoral calls to the residents of the Pacific Homes, against legal advice, opening up negotiations. In December 1980 a settlement was reached of \$21 million and approved by the courts and at a special session of Annual Conference in February 1981. The bailout of Pacific Homes was a denomination-wide effort. About \$4 million came from the GCFA, and \$3 million came from the Board of Global Ministries. The bishops were enlisted, and the annual conferences raised about \$2 million. The remaining amount coming from the Pacific & Southwest Conference. The total was later discounted to \$19.5 million because of how fast the money was raised. The settlement was structured as a loan from the Conference to Pacific Homes. It was restructured in 1991 and approved by the California-Pacific and Desert Southwest Conferences at their 1992 Annual meetings. Pacific Homes made the first repayment in 1992, with that money going to the Board of Global Ministries and other annual conferences that had made loans or donations. It was not until 1999 that Pacific Homes was able to repay the remaining amount, with California-Pacific Conference receiving \$9.1 million, the Desert Southwest Conference getting \$2.6, with the rest going to GCFA. The money received by the Desert Southwest was deposited with the Conference Foundation and helped fund a strategic plan and congregation development in the form of church starts, revitalization, and camping and retreat ministries.

The creation of a sixth Episcopal area within the Western Jurisdiction had been desired since first allowed in 1960. The Pacific & Southwest Conference was the largest in the Jurisdiction and had long been look at as the one to split. Studies and reports had been completed since 1964 to determine the feasibility of splitting that Conference. At the 1983 session of the Pacific & Southwest Annual Conference a resolution was approved, requesting "Jurisdictional Conference to postpone the creation of a sixth Episcopal area until such time as a request comes from the annual conferences whose boundaries are affected." An ad hoc committee was appointed to examine the feasibility of the proposal. They asked Rev. Michael Nickerson, Direct of Research and Design for the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry, to prepare a missional and demographical study on the creation of a sixth episcopal area and its boundaries. The study recommended division, with the new episcopal area consisting of southern Nevada, California churches on the Colorado River, and the state of Arizona. The committee also gathered information from the Districts. Two votes were taken in 1983, with the second coming out in favor of division. The chairman of the ad hoc committee, Rev. Don Brummet, reported that to the Jurisdictional Committee on Conferences that "there is no overwhelming reason not to divide."

The 1984 Western Jurisdictional Conference was held in Boise, Idaho. Since the potential division would affect the number of Bishops elected, it was placed first on the agenda of the Jurisdictional Conference. Norm Lawson, chair of the Jurisdiction Committee on Conferences presented the committee's findings and recommended division of the Pacific & Southwest Conference and the creations of a sixth episcopal area. After a debate, the Jurisdiction voted in favor of the recommendation. The Pacific & Southwest Conference was slit into two. The churches in Arizona, southern Nevada, and in the California cities along the Colorado River formed one

conferences. The second conference was made up of the churches in California and Hawaii. A new Episcopal Area was added at Phoenix, with the newly elected Bishop Elias Galvan selected to lead it. He was the first Hispanic minister elected to the episcopacy.

### Desert Southwest Conference

The founding session of the new Phoenix Area conference was held January 18-19, 1985 at Central UMC in Phoenix. There they went about the business of organizing the new conference. A name was chosen: Desert Southwest. The next decision made was settling upon four districts. No program staff would be added other than the District Superintendents. A Planning and Strategic Committed, chaired by Jackie Taylor, was created to draft the new structure of the Conference. An ad hoc committee led by Rev. Don Brummet was charged with formulating a mission statement. The new Conference contained 112 churches, 45,661 church members, and 208 ministerial members across three states.

The first session of the new Desert Southwest Annual Conference was held June 14-16, 1985 at Flagstaff. Conference Rules were adopted and many committees and boards were formed. At the second session in 1986 it was recommended that a programs staff person be hired as the District Superintendents found that they had too many other responsibilities. The resolution was approved, but narrowly. Rev. Michael Nickerson was hired as the first Director of Congregational Development and Conference Programs. For the 1987 Annual Conference, the Planning and Strategy Committee was ready with their report. "After a couple of sections of the report were adopted by rather close votes, the conference adjourned for lunch. A motion was made at the afternoon session to refer the report, revise and bring it back to the 1988 conference for action. The motion passed 128 for and 127 against." The revised report was approved at the 1988 session and provided the basic structure for the Desert Southwest Conference committees and agencies.

The Conference's first missional priority was new church starts. By July 1991 there had been 23 new churches started with a combined membership of over 2,000. A new and permanent home for the Conference office was found in 1994, after nine years of leasing space, with the site purchased at 1550 East Meadowbrook Drive in Phoenix. The mortgage was paid off and burned at the 2010 Annual Conference.

Bishop William W. Dew was assigned to the Phoenix Episcopal Area in September 1996 and served there until his retirement in 2004. He was one of 15 bishops at the 1996 General Conference who released a statement saying the church's restrictions on homosexuality was "hurting and silencing countless faithful Christians." Under his tenure, the "Crossing the Bridge" Strategic Plan was launched in 1998 and prioritized: 1) revitalize local churches, 2) start new churches; and, 3) expand Outdoor/Retreat Ministry. The "Bold in Christ" funding campaign raised \$4 million by 2001, with over \$10 pledged. In 2002 two more priorities were added to the Strategic Plan: "Equip Clergy and Laity for Effective Ministry" and "Support Outreach Ministries of Local Congregations." The final report for Bold in Christ, presented at the 2006 Annual Conference, notes that over \$8.1 million was raised; over 20 existing churches were revitalized; support was given to the Sidewalk Sunday program; nearly 30 new church starts, some of which have already been chartered as churches; and improvements made at Mingus Mountain and Potosi Pines Camps.

Bishop Minerva G. Carcaño was the first Hispanic woman elected to the episcopacy when she was selected in 2004 by the Western Jurisdiction. The next strategic plan was launched in 2007. The focus remained on the previous priorities. An additional campaign for an endowment fund, titled "Forward in Their Footsteps," was added. Unfortunately, the campaign floundered. "The campaign brought in over \$1 million dollars, far short of our goal. [The reasons were poor] ...economy, struggling conditions for many churches, and lack of leadership." The economic depression of 2007 forced the Conference to scale back on fundraising goals. Bishop Carcaño was reassigned in 2012 to the Los Angeles Episcopal Area, serving the California-Pacific Conference.

The Justa Center began in December 2006 with Rev. Scott Ritchey and members of the United Methodist Church, under the auspices of the Ecumenical Council of the Homeless. Programs and services were developed after asking homeless seniors what they needed to help their journey back into housing. Justa Center is one of the nation's only day-resource centers exclusively for homeless seniors (age 55+) focused on providing services that help the seniors on their path to home. Almost completely unique in its services, the Justa Center is not a drop-in center, a detox center, or even a senior center.

Bishop Robert T. Hoshibata was reassigned from the Portland Area to the Phoenix Episcopal Area at the 2012 Western Jurisdictional Conference. “In December, 2012, Bishop Hoshibata visited over a dozen offices in the United States Senate and House of Representatives in Washington, D.C., in support of The Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria and as part of the UMC’s Imagine No Malaria campaign.” As president of General Board of Church & Society’s Board of Directors (2012-2016), he held lead the Imagine No Malaria campaign. Bishop Bob, as he is fondly known, frequently conducts the singing at Annual Conference and has allowed some abuse of his person (remember the sock toss).

Across the denomination, liberals and conservatives have debated the same sex rights since 1972 and the approval of Book of Discipline paragraph ¶161G, entitled Human Sexuality. This section has been amended several times since then. It has caused much debate, tension, and demonstrations around the world. At the 2012 General Conference same sex rights supporters, who want the paragraph eliminated from the *Book of Discipline*, demonstrated and shut down the Conference for a few hours on the last day of sessions. In the Desert Southwest, the subject has been discussed and debate at almost every annual session since its founding, gaining in intensity since the late 1990s. The first resolution addressing the topic was passed at the 2001 Annual Conference (191 to 137), affirming the Western Jurisdiction Conference’s resolution of those liberals who “will not be silent” concerning the defeat of removing the same sex language (¶ 161G) taken at the 2000 General Conference. Since that time, many more resolutions have been introduced in favor of allowing full membership and clergy rights for same sex persons, though not all have passed. After a contentious 2016 General Conference, talk of splitting the United Methodist Church gained traction. They voted to refer all discussion about sexuality to a specially appointed commission, the Commission on a Way Forward. A special session of General Conference was called to act on the report of the Commission. Held February 23-26, 2019 in St. Louis, the meeting was “to consider several plans to move the denomination forward despite deep divisions over the inclusion of its LGBTQ members.” Three plans were presented, with the Traditional Plan approved, which continues and strengthens the UMC’s ban on the ordination and marriage of LGBTQ persons. The Judicial Council has found all or parts of many of the petitions that made up the Traditional Plan unconstitutional. This decision has pushed the United Methodist Church towards a split. The 2020 General Conference, postponed due to the Covid-19 pandemic and now expecting to meet in August 2022, will most likely be where a decision on schism is made.

Across the Desert Southwest Conference, the Covid-19 pandemic has impacted churches. Churches were closed and worship services suspended. Many vital ministries were stopped. Thanks to advances in technology, worship services have moved online and the 2020 and 2021 sessions of Annual Conference were able to be held virtually. The postponement of the 2020 General Conference caused the Jurisdictional Conferences to be postponed. Bishop Bob delayed his retirement by a year because of the delay in holding General and Jurisdictional Conferences due to the Covid-19 pandemic, and is set to retire October 1, 2021. Bishop Grant J. Hagiya, resident bishop of the Los Angeles Episcopal Area and California-Pacific Conference, will serve as acting Bishop of the Phoenix Episcopal Area and Desert Southwest Conference until the next time the Western Jurisdictional Conference meets (expected to be in the fall of 2022). The days ahead continue to be full of uncertainty. “Let us turn our energy and our faith to engage lovingly in the work that is yet ahead of us.” –Bishop Bob


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## II. History of Annual Conference Sessions

This is the 57<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference since the creation of The United Methodist Church, the 85<sup>nd</sup> session since the unification of The Methodist Church, and the 171<sup>st</sup> session of the Annual Conference representing the Pacific Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, the oldest of the merging and separating conferences.

This is the Thirty-Seventh Session of the Desert Southwest Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church since the formation of the Conference by action of the 1984 Western Jurisdictional Conference meeting in Boise, Idaho. The boundaries of the Desert Southwest Conference shall include the State of Arizona, also including that portion of Nevada consisting of Lincoln, Clark, Esmeralda and Nye Counties, and those California cities bordering the Colorado River, namely: Needles and Fort Yuma.

## IV. United Methodist Historic Sites

Historic Sites are buildings, locations, or structures which are specifically related to a significant event, development, or personality in the history of an Annual, Central, or Jurisdictional Conference (or its antecedents). Historic Sites are designated by formal action of the Annual, Central, or Jurisdictional Conference within whose regions the site is located. Such designation shall first be considered and reviewed by the respective Commission on Archives and History (or equivalent). After action by the Annual, Central, or Jurisdictional Conference to designate a building, structure, or location as a Historical Site, the president or chairperson of the Commission on Archives and History (or equivalent) shall advise the General Commission on Archives and History of the action taken and provide such documentation as may be required. The General Commission in turn shall provide an official Historic Site marker, keep a register of all Historic Sites, and maintain and ongoing file of pertinent information concerning them.

### **Site no. 261 Community United Methodist Church, Williams, Arizona**

On October 6, 1991, as part of this church's 100 Anniversary celebration, marker 261 was attached to the hundred year old building, recognizing it as the oldest continuously used Methodist structure in Arizona. (1991)

### **Site no. 279 Greenwood Memory Lawn Cemetery grave sites, Phoenix, Arizona**

Within the oldest sections of the Greenwood Memory Lawn Cemetery, Phoenix, Arizona, are the gravesites of three prominent and influential clergy and their spouses who are important to the beginning and development of Methodism in territorial and early statehood Arizona. These persons are Lewis J. Hedgpeth (1837-1912) and his wife, Margaret (1847-1923); George H. Adams (1836-1922) and his wife, Lucinda (1834-1911); and William J. Sims (1864-1952) and his wife, Elizabeth (1869-1935). Also, within this section of the cemetery are the gravesites of several other clergy and spouses from the first half of this century. These are Thomas F. Hughes (1877-1946); Alvin K. Stabler (1867-1916) and his wife, Cullie (1873-1946); Rufus B. McMican (1884-1950 and his wife, Minnie (1886-1961); and Gordon Chapman (1904-1950) and his wife, Charlotte (1896-1981).

### **Site no. 319 First United Methodist Church, Tucson, Arizona**

Mrs. Josephine Brawley Hughes came to Tucson from Pennsylvania in 1872 at age 33. She was a founding member of First Church, Tucson, wife of Governor L. C. Hughes (1893-96), [one of the] first public school teacher in the territory, co-founder with her husband of the *Tucson Star*, journalist, leader in the women's right-to-vote and temperance movements. Considered the "Mother of Methodism" for territorial and early statehood Arizona, she died in 1926 and is buried with her husband in the Evergreen Cemetery, Tucson. She is the only woman honored on a bronze plaque in the Arizona Capitol Building, now a museum. In 1991 she was inducted into the "Arizona Women's Hall of Fame." (1995)

### **Site no. 329 First United Methodist Church, Prescott, Arizona**

The United Methodist Church, Prescott, Arizona, along with Central United Methodist Church, Phoenix, Arizona, is one of the two oldest congregations of the Desert Southwest Conference. Each church considers pioneer circuit rider, Alexander Groves, as its founding pastor. He was appointed to the Arizona Territory at the organizing session of the Los Angeles Conference, Methodist Episcopal Church, South, in San Bernardino, California, October 26, 1870. During the present 1995-1996 Conference year, both congregations are celebrating their 125th anniversary; thus, the 125th year of Methodism as a continuous movement in Arizona. A subtle discussion as to which is number one or two depends on interpretation of the existing documentation. (1995)

**Site no. 330 Central United Methodist Church, Phoenix, Arizona**

Central United Methodist Church, Phoenix, Arizona, along with United Methodist Church, Prescott, Arizona, is one of the two oldest congregations of the Desert Southwest Conference. Each church considers pioneer circuit rider, Alexander Groves, Methodist Episcopal Church, South, as its founding pastor. During the present 1995-1996 Conference year, both congregations are celebrating their 125th anniversary; thus, the 125th year of Methodism as a continuous movement in Arizona. A subtle discussion as to which is number one or two depends on interpretation of the existing documentation. (1995)

**Site no. 340 First United Methodist Church, Las Vegas, Nevada\***

First Church, Las Vegas, founded in 1905 is located on its original site in downtown Las Vegas. In recognition of its significant ministries through this century it was awarded a United Methodist Historic Site marker. (1995)

\*Site deconsecrated when the church building was sold after the congregation merged and moved.

**Site no. 398 Holbrook United Methodist Church, Holbrook, Arizona**

Holbrook, Arizona has been served by Methodist circuit riders since 1883 and organized as Holbrook Methodist Episcopal Church in 1912. The first building was completed in 1913, with additions in 1935 and 1950. (2001)


