WHAT IS UMCOR?

UMCOR (United Methodist Church On Relief) connects the United Methodists Churches, its people, and congregation to partner with others engaged in God's global work that takes place in a variety of settings both local and in other countries.

UMCOR is the humanitarian relief and development arm of the United Methodist Church.

This past March a \$417,737 grant from UMCOR helped in recovery efforts in the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference after hurricanes Isiah and Ida spawned tornadoes and floods that devastated communities.

100% Of Advance contributions go to a designated cause. A portion of local UMC assessments fund the day to day operations of UMCOR.

Lakeview UMC will be hosting a Mission Bash (pasta dinner) on Oct 8th where half of the proceeds will benefit the Ukraine through UMCOR and half to local missions. All are invited.
