

# The Bridge United Women of Faith



#### Yuma United Women in Faith

Yuma First UWF had guest speakers from the Arizona-California Humanitarian Coalition at our April meeting. The ACHC has been providing basic humanitarian needs and advocacy at our border with Mexico for the past nearly 3 years. They provide water, food, a welcoming human presence and information to those who cross the U.S. - Mexico border to seek asylum. Seven of us accompanied ACHC staff to the border the following week, and helped to hand out water, make sandwiches, clean up trash, and take blankets home to be washed. A couple of us have continued to go out to the border weekly to assist ACHC in their work. We have met people from every walk of life and from so many different countries. The migrant's journeys have many times been dangerous, and some had been traveling for months. Now that Title 42 has ended and new policies are in place, it is uncertain what the needs will be going forward.

We also partnered with the Yuma Salvation Army in December to make and deliver 3 meals a day, 7 days a week to asylum seekers who had to stay overnight in a hotel pending their transport arrangements. Some had to stay longer if someone in their family tested positive for Covid or had to be hospitalized. We even got to help prepare Christmas dinner for the asylum seekers - a real blessing!

For Mother's Day we collected gently used purses, jewelry, and new lotions, nail polish and self care treats for the Crossroads Mission Family Shelter. The Mission has a celebration event, and the women at the shelter get to choose something special just for themselves.

There was a lot of interest in the Days for Girls washable products, but we found no new sewists to help with the effort.

On months that we do not collect products for the Yuma Period project, we collect classroom supplies for Roosevelt School. Roosevelt

 elementary school in our church neighborhood. They are always so happy to see our deliveries - especially since there are always special yummy treats just for the teachers and staff too.

During the summer we will be getting together monthly at local restaurants for fellowship, but no program.

The drive was so successful, we decided to find out how we can become more involved. Our President, Sally Hamill and our Secretary, Paulette Holler attended a graduation luncheon for scholarship recipients on May 25.

This was just one of the community groups we have become involved with. The second is A New Leaf Housing and Shelter. This organization will open a housing assistance center in Surprise in June of this year. Our group has decided to assist with a coffee club and will provide coffee, cups, sugar, creamer and gallon water bottles to make the coffee on an ongoing basis. We are also setting up a physical tour of the building so we can see what and where our donations are going for.

Even with all of this, the best part of the quarter came in May, as the United Women in Faith sponsored a concert by our church accompanist Honzu Guo and her new husband Leon Jin. The pair delighted the audience with their music selections. One was especially touching, as it had been created for our former Music Director. Afterwards everyone got to meet and greet the performers as refreshments were served. It was a truly delightful time.

So, even though our fantastic weather will come to an end and the desert temps will rise, the ladies of New Song United Women in Faith will find warm ways to share Christ's love in our church and community.

Robbie Tolan was shot by the Police and lived to tell his story. It is gripping and powerful account of his physical and mental recovery as he takes us along on his journey to get justice (or some form of it). Sybrina Fulton and her ex-husband Tracy Martin, Trayvon's parents also take us on their journey for justice. These first -hand accounts are sobering. Participating in the Reading program is expected of us but I hope that all of you feel that by doing so we become more informed, compassionate and are able to better to help our communities.

## West District Spiritual Growth - Carolyn Lodge

With this newsletter, we continue into the seven spiritual gifts described by Paul in the book of Romans. Today, we are going to look at the spiritual gifts of teaching and exhortation.

A person with the motivational gift of teaching is passionate about discovering and validating truth. A teacher is particularly concerned with the accuracy of information, especially church doctrine, and is often gifted with research abilities. Once again, from The United Methodist Church website on the spiritual gift of teaching: The gift of teaching allows people to transform data and information into life-changing knowledge. Teachers do not have to stand in front of a class to teach. Often ,gifted teachers communicate best in informal, one-on-one settings. Teachers have the uncanny knack of helping people learn effortlessly. People internalize and retain the knowledge and learning they receive from gifted teachers. Good teachers transform more than they inform. Think of teachers in your life that have changed the path of your existence. Are you grateful for them - even now?

Exhortation sounds like an imperious term, but it's really not. When you exhort, you are emphatically encouraging someone to do something. From our UMC website: The gift of exhortation is manifest in people who offer encouragement, wise counsel, unflagging support, and empowerment. (I still remember the day a wise person said to me: "Don't let that negative person live in your head rent-free!!") Those who exhort stay focused on helping people maximize their own potential and live from their own gifts and skills. Exhorters help people feel good about themselves, build confidence, and not grow discouraged. Often, those with the gift of exhortation make others feel good just by being present. What is the difference between exhortation and advice? As nouns, the difference between exhortation and advice is that exhortation is the act or practice of inciting to laudable deeds; incitement to that which is good or commendable, while advice is an opinion recommended or offered, as worthy to be followed; in other words, counsel. I found a website called "Made of Still," written by a young black Christian female. I like the way she summarizes exhortation:

"Exhorters can discern the spiritual gifts of others and help them use those gifts for the glory of God. They also have a knack for discerning which teachings are from God and which ones are from man. This gift helps them to guide people in their spiritual growth." Has your life ever been touched by a Christian with the spiritual gift of exhortation? Was it a parent, a teacher, a boss, or a friend?
