#### Eileen Guillermo



Nancy May Rowe Prayer Shawl Circle






**Prayer Shawl Ministry -** Once a year we bless 23-28 prayer shawls. Last June, Pastor Wendy Swanson blessed 26 prayer shawls and one quilt. The nine ladies who said prayers while knitting/crocheting these lovely prayer shawls are Betsy Augustine, LuAnne Bender, Sherry Howie, Ann Jakubowski, Sue Loe, Trish Killian, Doris Points, Nancy Mae Rowe, and Jeanne Saxion.

They present to others the prayer shawls for various reasons: death of a spouse or family member, illness, surgery, birth, marriage, confirmation, or graduation. These prayer shawls have been hand delivered with a little ceremony of a book mark explaining the prayer shawls and a little prayer. They are shipped or sent special delivery by a relative or special friend. The prayer shawl group meets monthly at the home of Nancy Mae Rowe, the group's mentor, leader, and coordinator. These prayer shawls are made with love and donated yarn which is stored in Nancy Mae's garage.

Hats and Mittens - With this same donated yarn, the group has a goal of 400 hats per year, a goal which they reach every year. Last year was great, as they made a total of 528 hats and 42 scarves. So far this year they have 245 hats and 12 scarves for our winter warm-up campaign. They are given to preschool through 5th grade students in two local schools and one neighboring school. Also, they are mailed to two Indian schools which covers all grades. Last year the Mission team collected over 100 pairs of mittens to be mailed with the hats and scarves to the Indian schools, as they get snow and cold weather.

Along with the yarn that is donated, they get yarn (wool and fancy) the ministry cannot use, material, and craft and sewing items that are still usable and not ready for the garbage can. Once a year they bring these items to a bazaar or outdoor market that the United Women in Faith hosts and give them away for a small optional donation. This money keeps them self-sufficient as they use it to mail prayer shawls, hats, scarves and mittens.



#### **TOP ATTRACTIONS**

From flightseeing to wildlife viewing, Anchorage has it all.

- The Chugach Mountains hold a wonderland of wilderness trails, peaks, rivers, glaciers, and wildlife
- There are 60 glaciers within 50 miles of Anchorage
- Anchorage is home to 1,500 resident moose, as well as eagles, fox, beluga whales, bears, salmon, and more
- Fascinating museums showcase
   Alaska Native, Russian, gold rush, aviation, and natural history
- Art galleries, concert venues, and creative performances and displays abound

### **NATIVE CULTURE**

Located within the traditional homelands of the Dena'ina Athabascans and the Native Village of Eklutna, Anchorage is now home to Alaska Native peoples from across the state. This unique blend of cultures is showcased via exhibits at the Anchorage Museum, demonstrations and life-size traditional dwellings at the Alaska Native Heritage Center, gatherings like the Alaska Federation of Natives meetings, the Native Youth Olympics, and the Indigenous World Film Festival, and public art by local Indigenous artists.

#### CUISINE

There are more than 1,600 eating establishments ranging from casual to fine dining.

Local chefs offer up mouth-watering creations, and cuisine reflects the city's global draw and diverse community. You'll find meals drawing on time-tested recipes, and discover a few found only in the Great Land. Menus include everything from king crab, halibut, and wild salmon to other surprising Alaska food specialties, whether fished, farmed, or foraged.

Anchorage also has over a dozen breweries, two distilleries, wineries, and a meadery to choose from.





#### **SPRING ADVENTURES**

Go birding in the Anchorage Coastal Wildlife Refuge. Find lingering patches of spring snow for some late-season skiing, sledding, or snowshoeing. Catch a live performance or art exhibit. Spring in Anchorage blossoms with wildlife watching opportunities, unique seasonal activities, and plenty of ways to experience the city's special blend of urban and wild.


**Northern Lights** – Anchorage is an accessible base from which to chase the northern lights, with prime locations, mild temperatures, and plenty of knowledgeable guides.

**Glacier Day Cruises** – Score a front row seat with great views of glaciers. You might also spy otters, birds, seals, and whales.

Changing Colors – Soak up the pink evening alpenglow. See blue skies reflected in Cook Inlet. Find fresh buds blooming along city greenbelts. Chase the changing colors of spring via Anchorage hiking and biking trails.

**Dog Sledding** – Try your hand at driving a team of Alaska sled dogs.

**Flightseeing** – Enjoy epic mountain and glacier scenery while flightseeing aboard a fixed-wing airplane or helicopter.





Wellness – Relax and recharge with a rejuvenating variety of spas, yoga studios, lounges, galleries, and other indoor spaces devoted to visitor wellness – mind, body, and soul.

**Sledding and Skiing** – Build up some momentum sledding at Arctic Valley or hope on a pair of skis (or board) for a day of spring skiing.


See a Show – With world-renowned musicians and Broadway hits as well as local theater and dance troupes, Anchorage is Alaska's prime entertainment spot.
