

Sixty-three years ago, on November 14, 1960, Ruby Bridges, just six years old, walked to William Frantz Elementary School, New Orleans, LA escorted by four federal marshals as a White mob hurled insults at her.

The parents and students continued on from Journey to their school. Journey UWFaith gave nearly 60 students colorful pencils at the end of their walk, and congratulated them for learning about the brave first grader, Ruby Bridges, who walked to school more than sixty years ago to help desegregate her elementary school.

## "We Believe that Love in Action Can Change the World"




#### Children — Me in the Kin-dom by Kathy Cook
